

Exciting Editorial Development opportunity with Evidence-Based Nursing

Evidence-Based Nursing (EBN) is delighted to offer two editorial development opportunities to support the professional development of nurses, midwives and nursing associates. We welcome expressions of interest from people who are clinicians, academics, researchers and/or PhD students, who wish to develop their publishing, peer review and editorial skills and gain experience working with an established team of editors. Successful applicants will be offered a 6-9 month editorial development opportunity supported throughout by an experienced Associate Editor and the editorial team. You will be offered a bespoke development plan and your contribution to specific activities will be negotiated with you. Your time commitment should not exceed 2/3 hours a week and this can be delivered flexibly. This may include editorial activities such as:

- Selecting articles for commentaries
- Reviewing and editing invited commentaries
- Writing for the Journal e.g. research opinion pieces, research masterclasses, and editorials
- Commissioning and/or writing blogs on topics of relevance to the Journal
- Contributing to social media activities of the Journal including podcasts
- Other aspects of the Journal depending on the skills and expertise of the individual

This is a voluntary position, and there is no remuneration related to the post. Travel or associated expenses will be reimbursed and you will have 12 months free access to EBN.

Thinking about applying?

To apply for this opportunity (* essential);

- *You should be a registered nurse, midwife, or nursing associate
- Have completed a Doctorate, or are near to completion
- *Have some experience of writing for publication (academic or professional journal papers)
- Have experience of writing blogs or other social media content and an active professional social media presence
- We welcome applications from individuals from under-represented groups, and those whose areas of interests align with that of the current Editorial team (ebn.bmj.com/pages/editorial-board/).

How do I apply?

Deadline for applications is **12 noon on Monday 22nd May 2023**. Please send the following documents to Alice Shuttleworth at ashuttleworth@bmj.com:

- A 2-page summary CV
- A 500-word expression of interest that should state;
 - Your areas of research and, or clinical interests
 - Your experience of writing for publication (academic or professional journal papers), and/or creating, blogs, web content, or other public facing outputs
 - What you would like to gain from the experience

If you are intending to undertake this as part of your current role/employment, please confirm that you have the support of your line manager to undertake this in your covering email.

What happens after my application?

Applicants will be informed of the outcome week commencing 5th June 2023. Shortlisted applicants will be invited to an informal interview in June or July with a member of the Editorial team and the successful applicants will commence this role from August 2023.
